
Type of electrical plug used with DOMELRE unit, Before the 1920's homes did not have electrical outlets. Early electric appliance cords were fitted with a male Edison socket base which could be screwed into a room light socket. A single room light fixture could be modified to accommodate multiple appliance cords by using a "cluster" which was a multi-socket adapter that screwed into the single light socket. Clusters came in different sizes with two to five light sockets.

Top view showing condensing unit construction. One-quarter horsepower repulsion start induction AC motor at left is connected to 12 cylinder compressor at right with three rubber cord belts. Contactor box is between the motor and compressor. Condenser coil is half-inch OD copper tubing surrounding the machimery connected with flare type copper tubing connections to the compressor and receiver tank at right. The condenser coil cage also serves as protection against the rotating machinery.


