Equation of the month is, Reynold's Number, Re = VL/v, where V = Time averaged velocity in ft/sec, L is the characteristic length in ft and v is the kinematic viscosity in ft2/s. Why do we need to know Reynolds Number? To determine if the flow is laminar or turbulent. Who is Reynold? Osborne Reynolds (1842-1912) was an Irish born innovator in fluid dynamics. Reynolds studied the conditions in which the fluid flow in pipes transitioned from laminar flow to turbulent flow.






ASHRAE HISTORY NEWS


